### Community

The School is situated in the center of the capital city Vilnius. Vilnius hosts the highest-rated schools in Lithuania. The students of VJG come from various parts of the city. Most of them are Lithuanian natives and some are from multinational families. The most common religious group in Lithuania is Roman Catholic. Although the school is religious, the student families are not necessarily Roman Catholic.

### School

Vilnius Jesuit High School opened in September 1995 as a non-government catholic school. Vilnius Jesuit High School is accredited by the National Education Agency and is a member of Lithuanian Non-governmental General School Association, Lithuanian Catholic Schools Association. The School is part of the Jesuit Global Network of Schools.

Currently there are 866 students enrolling in grades 1-12.

### Curriculum

The School implements primary, basic and secondary education and non-formal (extracurricular) education programs. The school bases its education on the programs prepared by it, the general programs of the Lithuanian General Education School adapted to its needs or the programs prepared by itself and approved by the Ministry of Education and Science. The content of education creates conditions for the acquisition of knowledge, general abilities, and competencies necessary for a full-fledged member of modern society that meet the state educational standards.

The Students are selected for Year 5 and Year 9 (1<sup>st</sup> High School year) after taking an admission test organized by the School. It tests the students' knowledge in Lithuanian Language, Mathematics, English and Religion. The number of students admitted may vary year to year.

All students study 2 foreign languages – English or German. They select which one is their 1<sup>st</sup> foreign language (usually started in primary school) and the other is their 2<sup>nd</sup> foreign language.

The High School years are numbered in roman numbers I, II, III and IV (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior and Senior, respectively). Year I and II the students have general timetables and before year III they choose subjects and levels (A (higher intensity) or B) to study in year III and IV. The School does not have IB subjects.

At the end of Year IV students take 2 to 6 National Examinations in the subjects they select (the Lithuanian Language exam is compulsory state-wide, and the Mathematics exam is required when applying to Lithuanian universities). Students may opt out of the Foreign Language exam if they provide an international certification with at least a B1 European language level.

## Grading and Ranking

During the schoolyear and final subject grades are graded 1-10 (10 being the highest; 1-3 are failing grades). Our School does not rank student grades.

The National Examinations are graded 1-100 (100 being the highest).
